School Facilities

All the classrooms in the school are millennium multi-media classrooms. Apart from the standard classrooms, special rooms and the Assembly Hall, there is a Grace Hall, a Student Activity Centre, a Lecture Theatre, a School History Gallery, a Library, a Multi-media Learning Centre, a Science and Innovation Centre, a LEGO Maker Lab, a Careers Education Resource Centre and Self-regulated Learning Centre, a Multi-purpose Function Room, a Campus Television Studio, a Social Worker Counsel Room, an English Room, a Chinese Heritage and Cultural Centre, a Gymnasium, a Parents Resources Centre, a Conference Room, a Meeting Room, an Interview Room, a Rock Climbing Wall and an Eco Fish Pond.

Facing global climate change, starting from 2009, our school was successful in obtaining funding from the Environment and Conservation Fund established by the Environmental Campaign Committee to sponsor “Eco-friendly Energy-saving Classrooms” under the Environmental Education and Community Action Projects Scheme. Besides, being sponsored by the Environment and Conservation Fund, “Green Lunch – School On-site Meal Portioning Project” was launched in September of 2011. A kitchen and meal distribution counter was constructed, and 10 thermo-closets were acquired. In July of 2021, our school was subsidised and assisted by the Government under Solar Harvest to promote the development of local renewable energy. A solar energy generation system with 30 solar panels were installed for free under the support by Electrical and Mechanical Services Department.

2. Achievements and Reflections on Major Concerns

Major Concern 1: To equip students as proactive, independent and purposeful learners who are visionary, innovative, excel in STEAM, and have broad national and global exposure

Achievements

● **To enhance students' proactive and self-directed learning culture**

- Self-management skills and good learning habits are crucial elements for students to become confident and self-directed learners. A series of assembly talks were therefore conducted and self-disciplined learning strategies were promoted to effectively equip students with the above qualities. Secondly, since students were encouraged to develop their lesson preparation habits, self-directed learning resources as well as e-Learning strategies such as “Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)” were introduced in the lessons of all subjects.
- Students are nurtured as confident learners through constant recognition and affirmation. The application of the teaching strategy “ShareStart” is an excellent platform to showcase the good practices and exemplars from students and this in return enhances mutual learning among the students themselves.
- Students were trained to develop questioning and problem-solving skills after setting learning goals at the beginning of the academic year. They were guided to conduct self-reflection regularly at different learning stages. In doing so, students can reflect on their learning progress and performance.
- During the COVID-19 pandemic, blended learning was implemented in our school which combines the advantages of face-to-face learning with online technology tools. Learning groups were created in Google Classroom for each subject in each form to facilitate students' e-learning. All teachers and students were get used to adopt the Google Classroom or other learning apps to study the learning materials before and after the lessons.
- The Teaching and Learning Committee (TLC) compiled a set of ‘online learning resources’. Students were assisted to spend time learning wisely, enrich learning experience, strive to achieve academic goals and most importantly, develop the habit of independent learning through the above online learning portal.
- A series of online learning resources such as E-books, vocal books, electronic periodicals, online resources and TV programmes promoting reading from the public libraries were made available in our school library. The library collection was further enriched with 530 copies of e-books, students could read anywhere at their own convenience.

- TLC liaised with various parties including the Education Bureau (EDB), Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education (HKAGE) and local universities to explore various opportunities for talented students to develop their potentials. This year, 74 S2-S4 elite students were nominated to join HKAGE screen program.
- A substantial amount of human and monetary resources were allocated to the English Department to create an English-rich environment. Firstly, two Native-speaking English Teachers (NETs) were employed. Secondly, a spacious and functional English room was designated to facilitate students' English learning. Students from different clubs such as the English Debate Team, Toastmasters Club and English Society can use our English Room to practise for their competitions and rehearse for the whole-school activities.
- To empower student members in the English Society to conduct English activities for the school, morning assemblies were held by English Society and each S5 and S2 class, which were well received.
- This can provide proactive and self-directed students with a better English learning environment. Survey findings showed that our students become more active in speaking English and have a stronger passion in English under the richer English environment. In addition, small class teaching was also arranged from S1 to S6. To showcase students' masterpieces, two newsletters and eight 'Embolden' were published by the English Society last year.
- English Speaking Days were held on Tuesdays and Fridays while Putonghua Day was held every Thursday. Students were encouraged to communicate in English and Putonghua in different scenarios on different week days. Most of the morning assemblies on Fridays were reserved for the programmes designed by the members of the English Society and the NETs. Various activities such as English Week and English Days were organised by students of the English Society, English Debate Team and Toastmasters Club.
- English Week was successfully held from 10th to 13th May with a theme of 'Intelligent Learning'. Various activities including 'AI and Art', the publishing of the newsletter 'Embolden', 'Audio Drama', 'Intelligent Reading' and 'Vivid Imagination' were organised. Through inter-subject activities and elements of scientific research, students' interest towards English was aroused. Specifically, Audio Drama Competition, whose theme was 'Dream Big, Stay_____', was organised instead due to class suspension and social-distancing measures. Students from S3 and S4 were well performed in the Audio Drama Competition. Learners' diversity is well catered in the blended mode learning situation.

- Student leaders are role models who set good examples for other students. To enhance students' leadership skills, students were given a myriad of chances to organise whole-school activities such as Academic days and English speaking days. Moreover, students are given plenty of opportunities to participate in assemblies and the "One-minute Wisdom" session on Wednesdays and Fridays is an example.
- To encourage more students to be high achievers, advanced sections were added in all subject assessment papers in junior forms. All students are encouraged to challenge themselves by attempting the questions in the advanced sections.
- A variety of programmes were conducted to cater for different learning needs of our students. Programmes like "Sun Kei Science Kids", "Biology Junior Secondary Pull-out Top Students Programme", "Mathematics Olympiads School Team", "Physics Olympiads School Team", "Chinese Language Writing Class" and "Cultural Learning Course of Chinese Language" were offered to encourage students to be self-directed learners and enhance students' exposure to the outside world. Besides, academic-related society such as Chinese Society, Biology Society, Mathematics Society and Astrophysics Society were inherited in this school year.
- Reading is one of the basic tenets in education. To promote a multi-dimensional reading experience, activities such as "self-directed reading scheme", Reading TED Talk, Reading KOL and 'Booktalk' with different themes were organised throughout the year.
- Sun Kei students had outstanding performance in the '21st Shenzhen Reading Month – Shenzhen, Hong Kong and Macau Reading and Writing Competition 2020'. A team of Chinese teachers: Ms. WAN Kit-ping, Ms. CHAN Wai-han and Mr. SOO Tsz-chung won the Senior Secondary Excellent Guidance Award, and Ms. CHAU Ka-yu, Mr. SHUM Tung-ho, Mr. SOO Tsz-chung and Ms. WONG Sau-fung won the Junior Secondary Excellent Guidance Award. Sun Kei Secondary School also won the Outstanding Organisation Award. This competition was organised by the Shenzhen Dushuyue Zuweihui Office.
- The 'Exhibition of Visual Arts e-learning in Hong Kong Schools' was organised by the Hong Kong Society for Education in Art (HKSEA). Ms. WONG Ling-yuet stood out from the local teacher applicants. Her teaching unit of 'I am the King of Stickers!' and her students' works were shortlisted for the exhibition. Besides, Ms. WONG was invited to be a guest speaker in the 'Hong Kong Visual Arts Education Festival 2020: Local Online Teaching Review Sharing Session' organised by Hong Kong Society For Education In Art. She shared her teaching experience with other teachers on the teaching unit of 'I am the King of stickers!'

● **To enhance mechanisms for students' self-monitoring habit**

- Assessment is a major tool to monitor students' learning progress. Efforts have been put to set assessment standards with valid and reliable measurement scales. After assessments, reflection sheets would be completed by students and they would in return get comments and feedback from their class teachers.
- Regarding the pedagogical aspect, a self-appraisal package 'Key Performance Indicators' has been compiled for senior form teachers (DSE subjects) to evaluate the effectiveness of one's teaching strategies in an objective way. Teaching and learning strategies for the teachers were reviewed for further enhancement.
- Teachers engendered and sustained students' intrinsic motivation with the use of students' self-reflection sessions in the exam review periods, hence developed students' self-monitoring and self-regulating skills.
- Data analysis of students' learning performance was conducted. Students knew their performance in uniform tests and examinations by making reference to the "Cross-Assessment Analysis" and "Percentile Difference Analysis". Senior form students were also given a projected grade with reference to the standard of the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (DSE) so that they could better plan for the Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS) choices and career planning.
- To help S6 students to prepare themselves better for the DSE exam, a Pre-Mock examination was implemented in September of 2020, followed by meetings among teachers to share their reflections and strategies to improve academic results in response to student performance in the HKDSE.
- To equip students with self-directed learning techniques and good examination skills for the DSE, both elite and consolidation classes were arranged for different targeted students. Besides, supplementary lessons were also conducted after school to further improve students' academic performances. Alumni with strong academic backgrounds were recruited to conduct small-group enhancement lessons after school. The feedback from students was positive.
- English learning is not confined only to the classrooms. English proficiency could also be enhanced through joining the English Society. Student members worked with the English Enhancement Team which was comprised of two NETs and two local teachers. These students benefitted from the guidance and coaching of the NETs and local teachers. Students organised various types of activities themselves, including online programmes on English Speaking Days and English live broadcast morning assemblies throughout the whole year.

- To encourage reading, reading award schemes were designed for students who have fulfilled their goals of reading in a year. In the academic year 2020 to 2021, over 98% students completed four reports on subject-based reading. There were 24, 12, 26 and 117 students received diamond awards, gold awards, silver awards and bronze awards respectively.
- **To build an efficient and effective eLearning environment and nurture STEAM innovators**
 - e-Learning is one of the major educational trends. A series of measures were undertaken to facilitate e-learning. For example, Wi-Fi infrastructure was built in the campus, mobile computing devices and learning tools like VR headsets for e-Learning were purchased. Teachers were used to adopt different e-Learning strategies, such as Flipped Classroom, Google Classroom and other interactive Learning & Teaching applications. All these measures provided students with more resources and directions to develop their learning habits and promote interactive teaching and learning as well as self-directed learning.
 - A number of teacher training workshops about e-Learning such as “BYOD” and “e-Learning” strategies were organised to equip teachers with the necessary skills in using different applications and software. Teachers were invited to have lesson demonstrations showing how the use of different e-learning elements could facilitate students’ learning. Every subject planned and discussed how to apply e-Learning in their teaching strategies. This was followed by in-depth discussion of how these demonstrated teaching strategies could be applied in different subjects and even KLA. In doing so, teachers exchanged their opinions regarding different instructional strategies and practices in catering for learners’ diversity.
 - Our school has a track record in promoting STEAM education in recent years. The KLA departments (Mathematics, Science, Technology, Arts) are devoted to create an atmosphere of innovation from existing resources and opportunities. We have also established a solid academic foundation for our students’ multiple activities.
 - The Integrated Science, Information and Communication Technology, and school-based STEAM project curriculum was further enhanced for all junior form students. Students will study knowledge on STEAM elements, coding, robotic in these lessons. Three STEAM activities are introduced in S1 and S2 integrated science curriculum as well.
 - The QEF project ‘AI x STEM’ was started in 2019 to cooperate with a university to promote Artificial Intelligence Programme advanced learning, application and practice in School-based Gifted Development. The topics covered in the QEF project include Genetic Engineering and pathology, Analytical Chemistry and the application of Artificial Intelligence Learning.

- Various projects were successfully carried out to build a professional STEAM network. Twenty students were nominated to join AI workshop through ‘CLP Engineer in School Programme’, 15 S3-S4 students participated in the ‘AI × SI Pilot Scheme’, the ‘HKU AI Database and Application’ was developed, the ‘CUHK Jockey Club AI for the Future Project’ was implemented in ICT, and the ‘CUHK Jockey Club Stem in Action Project’ was implemented in project learning. Ten best products in the ‘CUHK Jockey Club STEM in Action Project’ were selected by the Proposal Selection Panel, and some prototypes will be produced during the coming academic year.
- Students performed well in different international STEAM competitions. Sun Kei students won the Gold Award, the Bronze Award and the Honourable Award in the Korea Science and Engineering Fair 2020 organised by the Korea Science Service, the Gold Award in the Technology Category and the IYSA Grand Award in the ‘International Science and Invention Fair (ISIF) 2020’ organised by the Indonesia Young Scientist Association (IYSA), the Second Class Award in the The ‘2nd International Artificial Intelligence Fair (IAIF)’ organised by Sense Time Group Limited, the Second Class Award in the 12th ‘Beidou Cup’ National Youth Science and Technology Innovation Competition was sponsored by the Science and Technology Department of the Ministry of Education, the Youth Science and Technology Centre of the Chinese Association for Science and Technology and the China Satellite Navigation System Management Office.
- The Greater Bay Area STEM Excellence Award 2021 (Hong Kong) organised by the Hong Kong New Emerging Technology Education Association aimed to enable students to develop creativity in the STEM field and enhance students’ ability to innovate. A team of student won the Senior Secondary Section Gold Award (Artificial Intelligence Stream) with ‘Marine Guard’. Mr. CHOW Wing-hei won the ‘Top Ten Teachers’ Award in the Teacher Section (Secondary), and Sun Kei Secondary School won the ‘Top Ten Schools’ Award in the School Section.
- **To promote values education and broaden students’ national and global exposure**
 - WONG Ka-chun got the ‘Yes I can’ award in an American High School Student Exchange Scholarship organised by the ‘YES I CAN’ Education Fund Limited, and he participated in a student exchange programme in Foyil High School in this academic year.
 - Sun Kei once again conquered the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and co-organised the Online Exchange Buddy Programme with the Indonesian sister school, Santa Laensia High School. The event successfully held from 6th to 14th August. Twenty-three Sun Kei students were given the chance to communicate with their Indonesian counterparts online, to conduct group projects and to participate in the online classes specially arranged by Santa Laensia High School in the eight-day programme.

- “Guangzhou and Hong Kong, Technology without Boundary – Guangzhou Guangyuan Middle School and C. & M. A. Sun Kei Secondary School Online Exchange Event 2021” was successfully held on 15th July 2021 in which 36 S.2 to S.4 students participated. The three teams of students from our school and Guangyuan Middle School demonstrated and exchanged the achievements of STEM innovation and technology respectively. The students from the two schools performed well in the demonstration.

Reflections

1. Junior form curriculum should further be optimised so as to strengthen students’ generic skills such as analytical and critical thinking.
2. ‘Mixed ability classes’ in junior forms is implemented this year. Split classes which group students with similar abilities are also arranged as well in some of the core subjects in senior forms to cater for learner differences. Teachers reviewed that students shown motivations and confidence academically.
3. In view of the situation that students have been making noticeable academic progress in the recent years, a new framework should be formulated, and evidence based strategies should be implemented to promote deep learning in the coming year.
4. With the help of professionals from universities, more STEAM elements, such as cross-curriculum learning scheme, AI etc. should be introduced at the whole-school level.
5. To further promote e-Learning and implement the ‘BYOD’ policy, more innovative strategies such as interdisciplinary cooperation can be introduced. Besides, it is suggested to install interactive whiteboards in the classrooms to encourage students’ engagement in learning and to accommodates different learning styles of students. New activity, e.g. Battle of the Books, should be organised to promote reading.

Major Concern 2: To enrich students' learning experiences and nurture them with positive values and life competencies

Achievements

- **To develop students with a sense of gratitude, learn to cherish the things they have; to adopt a proactive and optimistic attitude towards life, in order to help them face the challenges and difficulties of growing up**
 - ‘Moral Education Day 2020’ was held successfully on 17th September. The theme this year was ‘Expressing gratitude, to cherish, and to become a better self amid the pandemic’. Mr. Kevin LAU Chun-to, the former Ming Pao Chief Editor and the current Director of One Media Group Limited, officiated the opening ceremony. Through sharing his own experience, Mr. Lau encouraged students to treasure their secondary school friends, hold on to their beliefs and dreams, and to reflect on how to make life more meaningful. S1 to S6 student representatives responded to the theme by making pledges and encouraging each other.
 - Career-related activities such as “job experience programme” were held. For instance, our school cooperated with Evangelical Lutheran Church Social Service Hong Kong (ELCHK) to organise career intervention and activities. Besides, 14 S5 students joined the “Job Coaching Program” in which they learn life skills in workshops, company visits in a 5-day summer programme.

- **To encourage students to formulate their individual plans by implementing the “Student Holistic Development and Life Planning Scheme”**
 - “Career Interest Inventory” for S6 students was arranged with a debriefing. The assessment was finished in early October. Students reflected that the result of the assessment helped them make better JUPAS choices.
 - Student Support Day was held on 20th and 27th November, on which students had individual interviews with their class teachers. Through the half-hour conversation, class teachers understand more about students, such as their study, interpersonal relationships and career planning, etc. Students also benefited a lot, and had new goals and hopes for future development.
 - The University of Hong Kong Parent-Child Admission Talk (Online) was held smoothly in the morning on 17th April (Saturday). The main speaker of the admission talk was Mr. Edwin NG, Student Recruitment Counselor of HKU Admissions and Academic Liaison Section. Two parallel academic lectures were then delivered by Dr. Rachel K.W. LUI from the Faculty of Science, HKU and Dr. Joe C.H. YUEN from the Faculty of Engineering, HKU respectively. HKU Student Ambassadors from the Faculty of Arts, Faculty of Business and Economics and Faculty of Law shared their learning experiences. Over 330 parents and students joined the Admission Talk.

- S3 students joined two individual student planning activities. In addition, one round of mock streaming was conducted to help students to make their choices. Official streaming was successfully conducted in July.
- **To provide multi-learning experience to broaden students' experience and cultivate students with positive value**
 - Assemblies with the theme of value of affective education were conducted for S1, S2, S3 and S4-S6 individually. 4 class teacher period activities were organized to promote the concept of “Self-care”, “Self-Compassion”, “Begin with the end in mind”, “Sense of belonging”.
 - During the school suspension period, teachers still kept a close contact with students. Class teachers made telephone calls at least once in every two weeks to show concern about their physical and mental health. Class teacher periods were still conducted in Zoom to let students feel connected with school and check whether students need emotional support. Class teachers also took this opportunity to encourage students to spend time wisely. A group of All Round Leaders took the initiatives to create an Instagram page to promote mental health.
 - The Physical and Aesthetic Week was held from 16th to 19th November this year, of which the topic was ‘MVP@New normal’. Different varieties of activities were organised, including Creative Composing, Stairs Climbing Challenge, Agility Challenge, Photos taking with masterpieces, etc., which enabled students to try different new learning experiences through apps under the new normal pandemic.
 - More than 85% of students participated in at least one extra-curricular activity or joined one interest class. The Student Potentials Development Committee (SPDC) conducted assessments for all S1 freshmen and collected their achievement records from their primary schools to identify the elite students. In addition, an “iPortfolio” was created for every S1 to S5 student so that they could have a clearer picture of their participation records and achievements. It served as a good indicator of their Other Learning Experiences (OLE) portfolio.
 - KAN Tsz-chun from 5P won the Hong Kong Student Sports Award with her outstanding swimming performance in the ‘A.S. Watson Group HK Student Sports Awards’ organised by the A.S. Watson Group.

- The Gospel Week was successfully held online from 5th to 12th January. The theme this year was ‘We are One • Peace with the Lord’. A range of activities were held, including an evangelical meeting, sermon sharing by minister Ms. WONG Man-ki from Sun Oi Church, testimony sharing by Dr. YIM Chi-shing, hymn sharing by teacher worship team, S1 online fellowship and gospel movie sharing, etc. It is grateful that the activities spread the gospel and encouraged students to live a fruitful life with God. Forty-four students decided to follow Jesus during the Gospel Week.
- Twenty-nine students were recruited to join the “Spiritual Team”. Members of the team participated actively in the school and church activities such as bible study, workshops of worship skills and evangelical events to serve the community. Although all these trainings and activities could only be conducted online, students treasured the opportunities to learn and they were nurtured to become more devoted Christians and Christian leaders.
- In addition to the school wide “Voluntary Service Ambassador” scheme (which promotes students’ participation and care about the community activities), other voluntary services were also arranged for all the students to sign up throughout the year. This year, only 7 off-campus voluntary services were organised due to COVID-19. But still we had a record of 1858 hours of off-campus service from all forms of students.
- More than 30 All-round Leaders participated in the ‘Yau Ma Tei Love and Care’ Experience Programme’ in August to serve the grassroots in the Yau Ma Tei region. The students prepared food, organised the supplies, delivered food to home, visited the elderly, and distributed food and daily necessities to the needy at Ferry Street Playground and Yung Shue Tou Park, hoping to bring care and warmth to the neighborhood.
- **To nurture a sense of responsibility towards society, fulfilling citizens’ responsibility through routine and special civic activities**
 - Flag raising ceremony was held in the morning assembly on the first day and last day of each school terms, national days, Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Establishment Day, National Constitution Day and National Security Education Day.
 - All students had participated in the National Constitution Day Quiz Competition and National Security Day Quiz Competition organized by the Education Bureau. Students were developed with a better understanding of our country's development and a stronger sense of our national and cultural identity.
 - Three Sun Kei Forums were arranged by the Moral and Civic Education Team. Forum topics were related to the current issues in Hong Kong, China and the Globe. Over 90% of S1 and S2 students participated in the Sun Kei Forum. Besides, two civic activities, “Election on Top Ten News in Hong Kong” and "Principles of Elections" Class teacher lesson, were also conducted.

- The theme of the Orbis Student Ambassador Campaign 2020-21 was ‘Bold for the Sights’. A group of S5 students took up the roles of Orbis student leaders and organized activities like charity sale, fundraising, blind tour experience, eyesight test, etc. from 19th to 24th April. These interesting activities aroused students' awareness towards challenges caused by blindness and eye diseases around the globe. They also raised funds for Orbis and used this chance to cultivate the spirit of giving among schoolmates. The team won the Outstanding Fundraising Project Award was invited to participate in ‘Virtual Trip to Bangladesh’ in Pui Ching Middle School on 14th August.

● **To organise leadership training programmes, broadening leaders’ horizon and exposure**

- Our School claimed the Best School Team award in the ‘20th Sai Kung District Outstanding Students Election’ for the fourteenth time this year. We were awarded with this honour starting from 2006 to 2009 and from 2011 to 2019, and this achievement boosts our students’ confidence and encourages our students to dedicate themselves to lifelong learning and active participation in social services in the future. Students also won the Outstanding Students Award in the Senior Secondary Section and Junior Secondary Section.
- PO Hiu-tung of 4M received the Sai Kung District Outstanding Youth Award in the ‘Sai Kung District Outstanding Youth Commendation Scheme 2020-21’ co-organised by the Sai Kung District Youth Programme Committee and the Boys’ and Girl’ Clubs Association of Hong Kong Jockey Club Tseung Kwan O Children and Youth Integrated Services Centre.
- LUI Michelle and NGAN Esther from 5R stood out from the applicants from about 100 local secondary schools and became two of the 200 young leaders in the 14th “Hong Kong 200” Leadership Project organised by the HKFYG Leadership Institute. This project aims at offering a more comprehensive, professional and forward-looking leadership training experience for secondary school students with excellent potentials to meet the future challenges and assist them to undertake the mission of promoting the development of society.
- The All-round Leaders organised and promoted intramural events including Academic and Life Planning, Student Quality Management, Moral and Civic Education, Coordination of Form Councils, Student Support and Administration of Extra-curricular Activities and Other Learning Experiences. They guided our students towards self-improvement and lifelong learning.
- The Student Council continued to serve the purpose of developing students’ creativity and self-management skills. By hosting important school functions, students were able to grow and learn in an atmosphere of freedom, autonomy and self-governance.

- To honour students with excellent performance in extra-curricular activities, the SPDC has set up a number of awards, such as the Excellent Performance Award, the Outstanding Leaders Award and the Outstanding Service Award.
- Student leaders are role models who set good examples for other students. To enhance students' leadership skills, students were given chances to organise activities in school. Moreover, students sought opportunities to participate in other activities such as Academic days, English speaking days etc.



Reflections

1. It is important to empower our students with a positive and compassionate mindset. They should also be reminded to think in an optimistic way especially during the time of adversity and challenges.
2. To inspire students with a sense of respect and responsibility towards society, our nation and the world, regular and ad hoc moral and civic education activities can be held in due course.
3. Considering the fact that school suspension may sustain and become a 'new normal' in the coming future, extra-curricular activities may be conducted online. In addition to this, more high quality online training courses about leadership and other generic skills should be provided to student leaders.

3. Student Performance

HKDSE Examination

Candidates of SKSS meeting the 3322 entrance requirement of universities for degree programmes in 2021 DSE Examination stand at 104, accounting for 87.4% of all Sun Kei’s participants in the examination. Students meeting the 22222 requirement for subsidised sub-degree programmes amount to 118, being 99.2% of the Sun Kei candidates sitting for the examination.



Achievements and Awards

Our school actively encourages students to step outside the campus to participate in all kinds of inter-school competitions. In 2020 – 2021, 46.37% of junior form students and 32.51% of senior form students have respectively participated in inter-school competitions. In the process, students have received various awards and honours making a total of 233 items this year including 15 championships, 15 second places, 14 third places, 5 first honour awards, 16 second honour awards, 9 third honour awards, 21 gold awards, 10 silver awards, 10 bronze awards and 48 merit awards. Details of the awards are shown in appendix IX.

Overseas Study Tours

Over the years, visits have been made to overseas destinations in Britain, Japan, Singapore, India, the Indonesia, and Australia as well as to cities in Mainland such as Beijing, Shanghai, Hangzhou, Shenzhen, Zhongshan and Qingyuan. At the same time, our school is active in developing an education network through pluralistic academic exchanges. In the context of global academic exchange development and related strategic alliance, we have established connections with the following schools.

- More creative reading activities in Book Fair have been launched. This strategy is so effective to attract students to participate.
